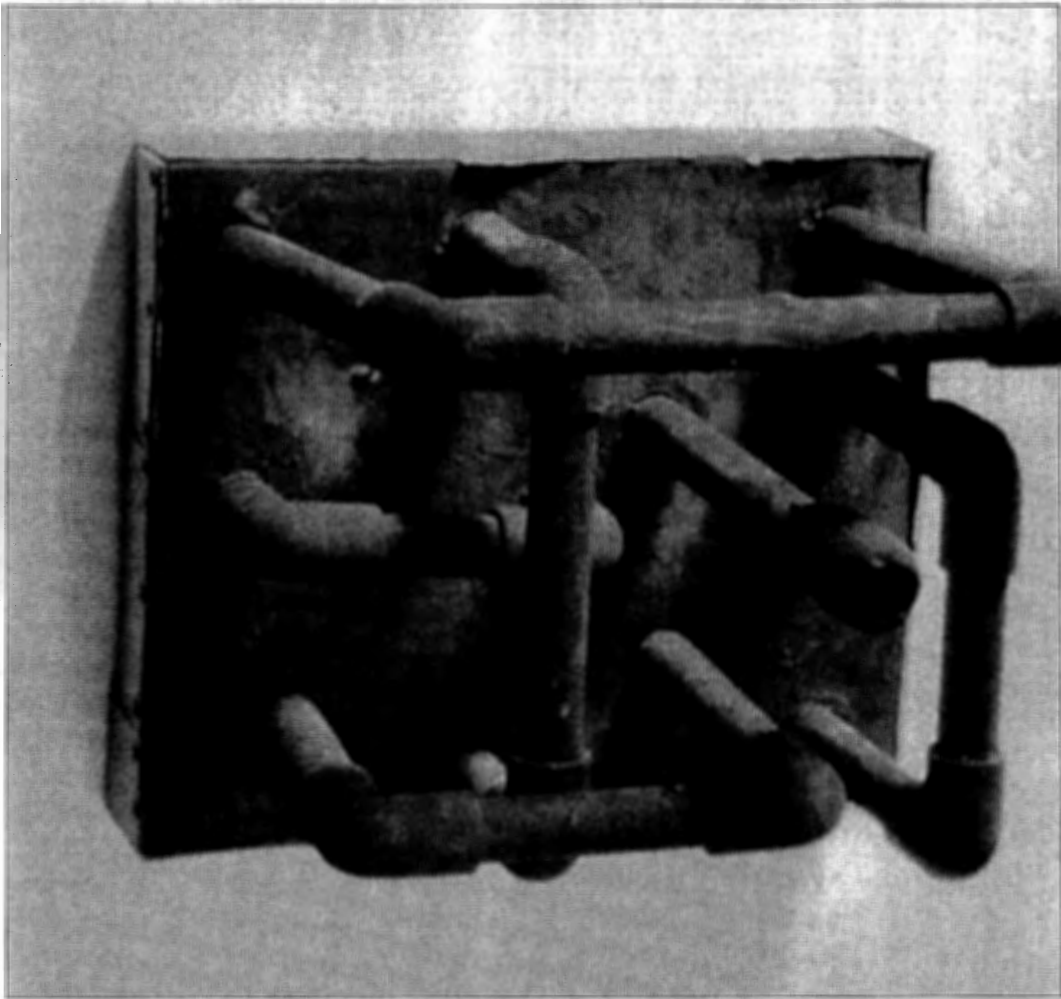

Registration/Academic Calendar

MARCH 29 (MON.) - APRIL 2 (FRI.)

- Fall 1999 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 40 of the *Spring 1999 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* for eligibility requirements.)

APRIL 5 - 30 (MON. - FRI.)

- Fall 1999 registration time assignments for students enrolled during spring 1999. For best course selection, register as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. Continuing students can register through May 28 (also August 2 through midnight August 13).

MAY 3 (MON.) - MAY 28 (FRI.)

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed registration for fall semester, registration for continuing students who have not yet registered, and registration for eligible students continuing from summer to fall. After May 28, these students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 2-13.
- Fall 1999 registration for new graduate and readmitted students. After May 28, new graduate and readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 2-13.

JUNE 11 (FRI.) - JULY 27 (TUES.)

- Fall 1999 registration for incoming freshmen and transfer students. Continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 2-13.

JULY 30 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your permanent address to ensure that your fall 1999 schedule/bill is mailed to the correct address.

AUGUST 2-13 (MON. - FRI.)

- Final registration and schedule adjustment for continuing, new graduate, and readmitted students.
- Schedule/bills mailed (to the permanent address) to all students who confirm register by August 6.
- Final registration period for all incoming freshmen and transfer students who did not register in June and July (except those in arts and sciences and business attending the final orientation on August 17-19).

AUGUST 13 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** for all students, both undergraduate and graduate (except for those incoming freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences and business attending the final orientation), to register for fall courses. **Registration must be completed by midnight to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester.** After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a **\$50 late fee** is charged. (See page 40 for late-registration information.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a **full refund** of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges. (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program as well.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See page 41.)

August 20 (Fri.)

- Schedule/bill distribution for students who did not receive a schedule/bill in the mail and for students who need a revised schedule/bill, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Coors Events/Conference Center.
- Drop/add time assignments begin for all incoming freshmen and transfer students. (See page 19.)
- ACCESS (formerly SAVE) registration available through CU Connect or in person at Continuing Education Office, 1505 University. For information on eligibility and times for registration, please call 303-492-5148 or visit the ACCESS website at www.colorado.edu/conted/access.htm. (See page 35.)

AUGUST 22 (SUN.)

- Drop/add time assignments begin for continuing, new graduate, readmitted students, and faculty/staff. (See page 19.)
- Coors Events/Conference Center is open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for drop/add, schedule/bill distribution, and late-registration screening. Beginning on Monday, August 23, these registration services are located in the basement of Regent, room 1B60, through Wednesday, September 1. (See page 19.)
- Registrar's, Buff OneCard™, and Bursar's Offices are open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for limited services.

AUGUST 23 (MON.)

- Classes begin.

AUGUST 31 (TUES.)

- Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; continues on Wednesday, September 1, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See page 41.)

SEPTEMBER 1 (WED.)

Add Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form to add a course (through September 10).* **NOTE:** After 5:00 p.m. on September 1, CU Connect and web registration are only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on September 8, the drop deadline). (See page 20.)

Wait List Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add your name to a course wait list. (See page 17.)

Tuition Payment Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to pay full tuition and fees and to turn in a deferred tuition agreement. **No grace period.** (See pages 31-32.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to waive university-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center.
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to waive UCSU student fees.
- **Deadline** to request refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See page 11.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) for private scholarship checks to be received in the financial aid scholarship office to avoid late and service charges.

SEPTEMBER 6 (MON.)

- Labor Day holiday. University closed.

SEPTEMBER 8 (WED.)**Drop Deadline:**

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* appearing on your transcript. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form and you must be passing your course to drop it.* (See page 20.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed \$200 in tuition and fees. (See page 39.)

SEPTEMBER 10 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean. **NOTE:** Instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See page 20.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, and pass/fail and no-credit status on courses. (See page 20.)

SEPTEMBER 22 (WED.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees. (See page 41.)

OCTOBER 1 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** for students who have three or more final exams on the same day to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See page 5.)

OCTOBER 6 (WED.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning your dean. (See page 20.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees. After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due. (See page 41.)
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition. **No grace period.**
- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office. (See page 41.)

OCTOBER 18-22 (MON. - FRI.)

- Distribution of the *Spring 2000 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* in Regent foyer, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (except Monday, October 18, until 6:00 p.m.) and UMC 155, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Beginning Monday, October 25, distribution is in Regent 105.

OCTOBER 25-29 (MON. - FRI.)

- Spring 2000 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 40.)

NOVEMBER 1-28 (MON. - SUN.)

- Spring 2000 registration period for continuing degree students enrolled during fall 1999.

NOVEMBER 25-26 (THURS. - FRI.)

- Thanksgiving holiday. University closed.

DECEMBER 8 (WED.)

- Last day of classes for fall 1999.

DECEMBER 9-10 (THURS. - FRI.)

- Reading days.

DECEMBER 10-17 (FRI. - FRI.)

- Final exams for fall 1999. The first exam begins 7:30 p.m. on Friday, December 10. (There are no exams on Sunday, December 12.)

DECEMBER 18 (SAT.)

- Fall 1999 commencement, Coors Events/Conference Center, 9:30 a.m.

JANUARY 10 (MON.)

- Spring 2000 classes begin.

JANUARY 17 (MON.)

- Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. University closed.

MARCH 27-31 (MON. - FRI.)

- Spring break. No classes.

MAY 1 (MON.)

- Last day of spring 2000 classes.

MAY 2-3 (TUES. - WED.)

- Reading days

MAY 4-10 (THURS. - WED.)

- Final exams for spring 2000. The first exam begins at 7:30 a.m. on Thursday, May 4. (There are no exams on Sunday, May 7.)

If you have three or more final exams scheduled on the same day, you are entitled to arrange an alternative exam time for the last exam or exams scheduled on that day. To qualify for rescheduling final exam times, you must provide evidence that you have three or more exams on the same day, and arrangements must be made with your instructor no later than the end of the sixth week of the semester (Friday, October 1, 1999).

Moscow, Russia

COURSE: "Politics of Russia"

HIGHLIGHTS: Students will visit the Romanov Palaces in St. Petersburg. Excursions in Moscow will include the Kremlin and Red Square. The experience focuses on politics and the political history of Russia and the Soviet Union.

Beijing, China

COURSE: "Arts of China"

HIGHLIGHTS: An excursion to the Great Wall will be one of many in China. Students will each have a Chinese buddy to help them explore Beijing and Chinese culture.

Kathmandu, Nepal

COURSES: "Religion of Nepal" and "Nepali Economics"

HIGHLIGHTS: Students will participate in a one-week trek in the Himalayas, a two-day jungle safari, and a four-day remote village living experience.

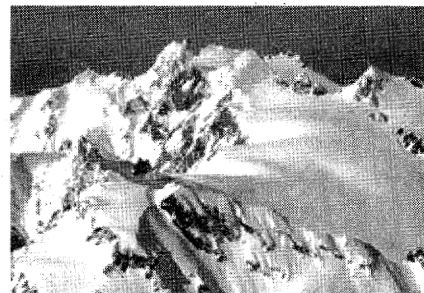

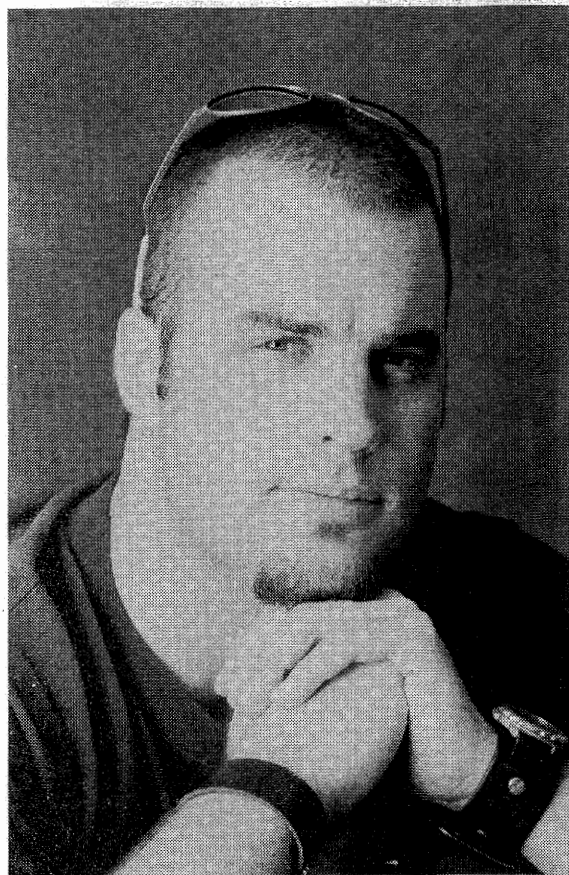

Art Contest Winner



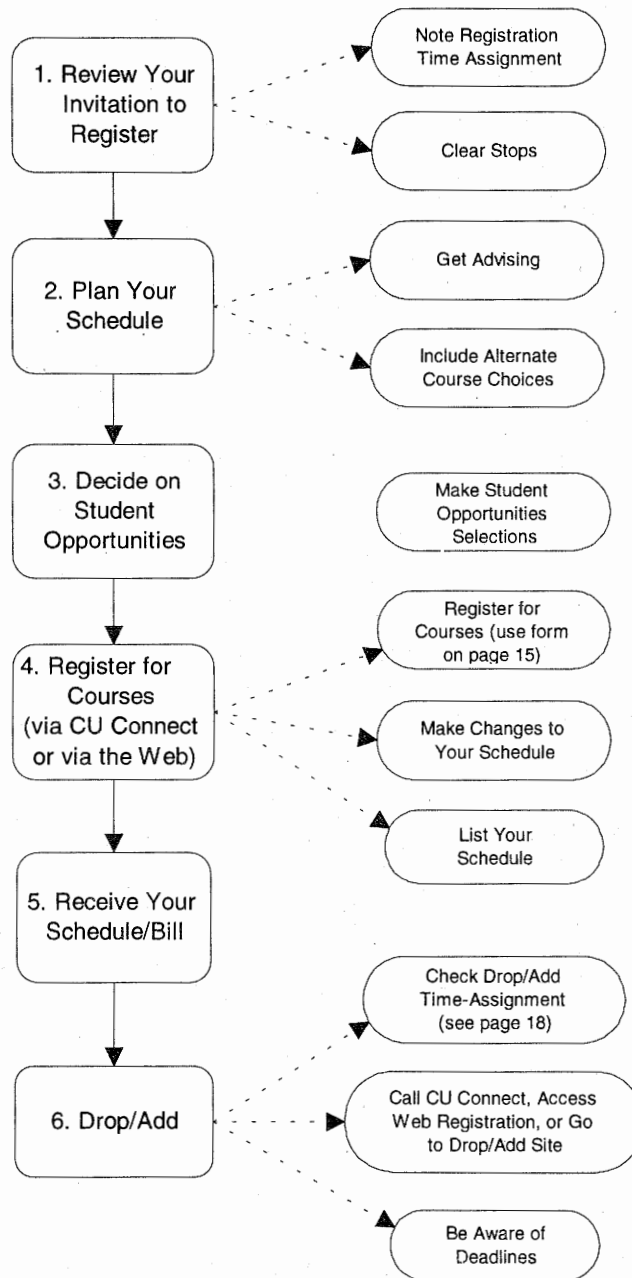
Rich Evans

Six Easy Steps to Registration



This *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* (RHSC) contains information you need to register for the fall 1999 semester, adjust your schedule, and pay your bill. If policies or procedures change, you will receive further information.

The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following the catalog policies for your year of entry into a specific program at CU-Boulder.

Although this handbook was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time of its printing (March 3, 1999), all information is subject to change.

The University of Colorado at Boulder has a strong institutional commitment to the principles of diversity and takes affirmative action to achieve that end. The university does not discriminate in its educational and employment programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, creed, religion, or veteran status.

Registration

You can call CU Connect (our telephone registration system) or access web registration to register for courses, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register, you receive immediate confirmation or denial of your enrollment in courses.

Registration Deadline - All students must complete registration by **midnight on August 13, 1999** to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester 1999. (**Exception:** Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences and business orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 19.) Students who do not register by these dates (including graduate students) are subject to late registration and a \$50 late fee.

NOTE: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call 303-492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-5841 (TTY).

1 Review Your Invitation to Register

Currently enrolled students:

You can access your personalized invitation to register for fall semester 1999 in the following ways (it will *not* be mailed to you):

- **Look on PLUS** (Personal Look-Up Services) on the World Wide Web at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. Use your student ID number and your PIN to access PLUS.
- **Check your e-mail.** It was sent to you on March 3 and an updated version sent on April 2 if you had an active university e-mail account. If you don't have a university e-mail account, you can create your own account through PLUS (<http://www.colorado.edu/plus>). Call Information Technology Service Center at 303-735-HELP (303-735-4357) if you need help creating an e-mail account. **NOTE:** For security reasons, we did not include PINs or student ID numbers on the invitations to register sent via e-mail.
- **Come to the registrar's office** for a copy of your invitation to register.

All new and readmitted students:

You'll receive your personalized invitation to register in the mail (mailed to your mailing address) or at orientation (if required).

Your invitation to register includes:

- **Your Personal Identification Number (PIN)** - If you are a new or readmitted student, your invitation to register includes your PIN. Your PIN, in combination with your student number, allows you to access web registration, CU Connect (our telephone registration system), the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) on the web and the financial aid telephone system. Certain data specific to you is available on these systems, and your PIN controls access to this information. Your PIN is a randomly set number and must be kept confidential. **Be sure to memorize your PIN as it**

remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.

If you feel that your PIN is not secure and you wish to change it, you can change it via PLUS or come in to the registrar's office in Regent 105.

If you forget your PIN, you can call the registrar's office at 303-492-6970 or come in to the office in Regent 105.

- **Your registration time assignment** - This is the date and time you can register for courses. You can register any time after your time assignment begins through the registration deadline (see the registration/academic calendar for specific dates). It is to your advantage to register as soon as possible after your registration time assignment begins. You can also call CU Connect at 303-938-8110 or check your status on the web to find out your registration time assignment. (**If using CU Connect, enter 997 for the fall semester term code when prompted.**)

Registration time assignments for undergraduate continuing students are based on the total number of hours completed at CU (any campus), transfer credit, and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of February 12).

Freshmen	0-29 hours
Sophomores	30-59 hours
Juniors	60-89 hours
Seniors	90-123 hours
5th Year Seniors	124 hours and above

Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, time assignments are random.

- **Advising notice** - If required by your college or school, consult with an advisor before registering. See page 36 for more information.
- **Other stops** - Stops are holds that the university puts on student records for various reasons. Stops may originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. If you have any stops on your record, you are not allowed to register until you have cleared them all. Be sure to clear all stops at least 24 hours before your registration time assignment.

2 Plan Your Schedule

Use the schedule planning worksheet on page 13 to fill out a preliminary schedule for fall 1999. Then, fill out the registration form on page 15 before registering. It is a good idea to include alternate course choices on your registration form in case courses you request are full. Refer to page 16 for information about course available lists.

3 Decide on Student Opportunities

In addition to the mandatory fees you must pay along with your tuition, there is a group of student opportunities

available to you for which optional fees are charged. The opportunities consist of various services provided by the university, tickets for concerts, plays, and the like, and club and student groups in which you can participate or merely provide money for their use.

When you first access registration (either via CU Connect or the web), you will be given a brief description of the student opportunities fees available to you and be prompted to choose (or not) each opportunity. After you've made your choices, you'll be prompted to confirm them. With this step completed, you can register for classes.

Student opportunities you have chosen will appear on your tuition and fee bill. If you want to change any of the student opportunities originally chosen, you **cannot** do so via CU Connect or the web. Instead, you must call the appropriate office at the phone number listed below.

Refunds will be given up to the tuition payment deadline (September 1).

DESCRIPTIONS OF STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES FEES

Following are descriptions of all the opportunities available to you, including the fee for each opportunity.

Free, year-round services provided by **Career Services** in Willard Hall include career counseling, career-planning and job-search workshops, the career library, the alumni career network, video practice interviews, and the *Discover* computerized career-guidance system. Two additional services available for a fee are listed below.

Career Connections \$35.00

For students graduating by August 2000. The prime time to use Career Connections is during your final year at CU. During the semester connect with employers seeking college graduates by taking advantage of weekly interviewing opportunities, having your resume referred to employers, obtaining employment vacancies, and networking with employers. *Contact Career Connections during the first week of classes for dates of the mandatory orientation meeting.* 303-492-4100.

Cooperative Education and Internships \$55.00

For undergraduate and graduate students seeking work experience before graduation. Each year, more than 7,000 internships are available in business, engineering, art museums, social service agencies, and environmental and governmental agencies. Contact the Co-op Office (Willard 18) early in the semester to complete necessary materials. Full refunds are granted until the drop/add deadline. This service is good for 12 months from enrollment. 303-492-4129.

Club Sports \$4.75

Club sports, which are partially funded by student fees, often require participants to pay out-of-pocket expenses which may limit their involvement in the sport. This fee helps support club sports, so there are fewer out-of-pocket expenses for the participants, and it also offsets some of the overhead costs of the sports. There are currently over 30 club sports programs, with athletes competing in local, intercollegiate, regional, and sometimes national competitions. Coed sports funded include:

bicycle racing, cricket, fencing, field hockey, figure skating, fly fishing, in-line hockey, kayaking, racquetball, rodeo and western heritage, running, speed skating, squash, strength and conditioning, tae kwon do, triathlon, waterpolo, and weightlifting. Men's sports are: baseball, diving, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, swimming, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. Women's sports are: diving, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, softball, swimming, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. 303-492-5471.

College of Music Concert Card \$30.00 per card

The hot sounds of jazz! International dance! The classical repertoire! The best of musical theatre and opera! Each concert card gives you \$60 worth of Artist Series and Lyric Theatre tickets for only \$30—a 50% savings over single ticket prices! Cards are valid for the entire 1999-2000 season and let you choose from a variety of performances. Concert cards give you the flexibility to decide how many tickets you want and where you would like to sit. All you have to do is present your card at the box office when choosing tickets. *Concert cards will not be mailed to you.* Bring your student ID and proof of payment to Imig Music C103 to pick up your College of Music Concert Card. 303-492-8008.

Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender

Resource Center \$5.00

The Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Resource Center serves as a central clearing house for information about gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender (GLBT) issues. Open to all regardless of sexual orientation, the center provides resources; information dissemination and referral; and educational, cultural, and social programming including LesBiGayTrans Awareness Month and the Lambda Rising GLBT Studies conference. Although a department within the Division of Student Affairs, the GLBT Resource Center receives no state general funds or other student fee money. Fees will fund the center's programming, and contributors will have the option to receive *CU Out & About: A Publication of the Lesbian, Bisexual, Gay and Transgender Community at the University of Colorado at Boulder* and supplemental events calendars. Call 303-492-1377 for more information or stop by Willard 334.

Student Groups \$4.95

You may call any time after your time assignment begins. **After registering via CU Connect, list your classes by pressing 5# to verify your schedule.**

Registration via the web - NEW! You can now register for courses via the web. First complete the registration form on page 15. Then go to PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus/> and select the "Registration" button. Follow the instructions shown on the web registration pages. Be sure to verify your schedule via the web when you're done registering.

CU Connect and web registration are normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight, and on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. (See page 14 for exceptions.)

CU CONNECT AND WEB REGISTRATION HOURS

CU Connect and web registration are normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight. They are also available on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight.

Exceptions:

- *From May 30 through July 27*, CU Connect and web registration are only available to incoming freshmen and transfer students (on specified dates). Continuing students, new graduate students, and readmitted students will not be able to do any registration or schedule adjustment during this time period (until August 2).
- *Limited hours -- August 19, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; August 22, 10:00 a.m. to midnight; September 1, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.* for adding courses and adding your name to course wait lists. **Note:** After 5:00 p.m. on September 1, CU Connect and web registration are only available for dropping courses through 5:00 p.m. on September 8, the drop deadline.

CU Connect and web registration are *NOT* available on Saturdays or on May 31, July 4, July 28-August 1, and August 15-18.

Need registration assistance? If you have problems or questions concerning telephone or web registration, call the registrar's office at **303-492-6970** and press "1" to speak with a registration assistant. Call between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. MST, Monday through Friday, except on university holidays. Recorded registration information is also available at this number 24 hours a day (press "2" to hear recorded registration information).

Once you have registered, make adjustments to your schedule either via CU Connect or the web through the **registration deadline, midnight on August 13.**

(Exception: Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences and business orientation session in August must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 18.) After these dates, see pages 19-20 for instructions on making final schedule adjustments during the drop/add period.

LINKED COURSES

Linked courses are lecture courses that have required recitations and/or labs. In the course listings, you can identify a linked course because *the call numbers for linked lectures are not listed*. Only the call numbers for the linked recitation or lab are listed. (For courses that have a required lecture, recitation, and a lab, the call numbers *are not listed* for the lecture and recitation; they are *only* listed for the lab.)

NOTE: This does not apply to courses that have a required lab with a different course number, e.g., EPOB 1210 General Biology 1 and EPOB 1230 General Biology Lab 1.

To register for linked courses, enter the call number for the lab or recitation only. When you enter the call number, the system automatically "links" all other sections of the course and either enrolls you in all sections of the course or gives you the option of placing your name on a wait list, if available, for all linked sections of the course.

CONTROLLED ENROLLMENT COURSES

Controlled enrollment sections of a course are ones that have specific restrictions placed by the department that offers the course. They have a section number between 700 and 999. The call numbers are not published for controlled enrollment sections. To find out if you qualify for a controlled enrollment section, contact the department that offers the course. If you are eligible, the department will either enroll you in the course or give you the call number so you can register for the course via the web or via CU Connect.

SEARCHING FOR COURSES

You may need to search for a new section of a course for the following reasons:

- Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered *after the Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published. When this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change.

- The section you request is full.

You can search for available sections in the following ways:

- You can conduct on-line course searches via web registration. The web registration course search tool allows you to search by subject, level, course number, core requirements, and by meeting time. The course search is updated on a real-time basis, so if you find a course you would like to sign up for, you immediately know whether there is still room in the course. You can access web registration via PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.
- The schedule planner is a tool to find out additional course information. Using this feature, you can also search for courses by subject, core requirements, and by meeting time. When a course is displayed, you can access the course description, required books, and student ratings of the course. In addition, you can map out your schedule to show when you have courses and other scheduled commitments, such as work. The schedule planner is updated on a daily basis during registration periods, so it is a good planning source, but does not display up-to-the-minute course availability. You can access the schedule planner feature via PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.
- If you request a course section that is full via CU Connect, the computer voice asks you if you want to conduct a search for other open sections of that course. If you do, press **7#** when prompted. CU Connect will search for other sections of the course that are available and that will fit your schedule. If another section is available, you can register for that section.
- Lists of available courses can be found at the Coors Events/Conference Center (August 20 and 22), in Regent 1B60 (August 23-September 1), and in Regent 105.

WAIT LISTS

Throughout the registration and drop/add periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it is full, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. There are two types of wait lists:

- *Automatic wait lists* are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.
- *Resequenced wait lists* use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect and web registration informs you if a class you have requested has a wait list and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. On CU Connect, press **9#** when prompted and listen for verification. On the web, select "submit" and wait for verification. **NOTE:** CU Connect and web registration do **not** tell you what type of wait list is used for the course.

When you place your name on a wait list, the number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list

positions constantly change during the registration and drop/add periods, it's a good idea to check your schedule frequently to find out your position on the wait list. To find out your wait-list position, you can either call CU Connect and list your schedule by pressing 5# (see the instructions on your registration form) or check your schedule via web registration. If you are wait-listed for any courses, your wait-list position (normally current within the last 24 hours) will be announced when you list your schedule via CU Connect. If looking at your schedule via web registration, you'll be able to see your wait-list position. Wait-list positions are normally updated nightly.

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course, even if you're first on the wait list.

When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you are automatically enrolled in the class. *No verification is sent.* If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, *drop the course as soon as possible.*

NOTE: Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit (see page 37). You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an F for that course.

DEADLINES FOR WAIT LISTS

You may place your name on course wait lists through **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 1.** At that time, all wait lists will be frozen. This means you cannot add your name to a wait list after September 1 and *there is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after this date.*

If you are still on a wait list as of September 2 and are still interested in taking that course, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. In that event, the department will give you a signed special action form to add the course. (**NOTE:** After September 1, you need the signature of the instructor on a special action form to add a course.) All department wait lists are can-

celed at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 10, the deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean.

NOTE: If you're on the wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on September 1, and you don't get enrolled in the course (undergraduate courses only), you'll be eligible to reserve the course the next time it is offered through the Course Reservation Program. (See page 40.)

5 Receive Your Schedule/Bill

You can receive your schedule/bill several different ways:

- If you register by August 6, your schedule/bill will be mailed to your permanent address by mid-August.
- If you make significant changes to your schedule or need another copy of your schedule, you can get a printout of your revised schedule/bill at the distribution sites listed below.
- If you register after August 6, you may pick up your schedule/bill at the following distribution sites.

6 Drop/Add

You may make final adjustments to your schedule anytime after your drop/add time assignment begins through the add and drop deadlines.

DROPPING AND ADDING COURSES

Complete the drop/add form on page 23 of this handbook, filling out call numbers, department abbreviations, course numbers, and section numbers of courses that you want to drop and/or add to your schedule. Because there may be many closed courses, have several alternate courses selected. See pages 38-39 for information about course available lists on the web. Course available lists will also be posted at the drop/add sites listed on this page.

You should plan to do all your drop/add activity either via CU Connect or web registration at a drop/add site (listed on this page), or using any combination of these these methods. If you have questions or concerns about your schedule, you should see your academic advisor or dean's office. If you have questions about a course in particular (regarding restrictions, pre-requisites, wait lists, etc.), you should see the appropriate academic department.

DEADLINES FOR ADDING COURSES

• **Add Deadline** - The deadline to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 1.**

To add a course after September 1 and through September 10 you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course.

• **Deadline to Add Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Friday, September 10.** (NOTE: You must have instructor's signature on a special action form to add a course after September 1 and through September 10.)

No adds are permitted after September 10 unless there are extenuating circumstances.

September 10 is also the deadline to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses. These changes can be made at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on September 10.

DEADLINES FOR DROPPING COURSES

• **Drop Deadline** - The deadline to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* grade showing on your transcript is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 8.**

For courses dropped after Wednesday, September 8 (5:00 p.m.), no tuition and fee adjustments are made and you will receive a *W* grade on your transcript for dropped courses.

To drop a course after September 8 and through October 6 you must be passing the course, and a special action form must be signed by your instructor and turned into the registrar's office.

• **Deadline to Drop Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to drop a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, October 6.**

After October 6 you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.).

To drop a course after this date you must have your dean's approval, as well as the approval of your instructor. Their signatures must be on a special action form or your request will not be processed.

Fall 1999 Student Course Fees

Course fees are assessed to help offset the higher costs of specialized supplies, equipment, materials, and instructional and related support that are required to teach courses in certain departments. **NOTE:** 1998-99 course fees are listed by each department in the course listings beginning on page 44. A list is also available at the Bursar's Office, and on the web.

Enrollment Deposit

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the university until you:

- drop *all* classes in a semester within established dates and guidelines (see page 41), or
- officially withdraw within established dates and guidelines (see page 41), or
- graduate.

At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you may have, and a refund check is mailed to you within approximately eight weeks. Update your permanent address at the Office of the Registrar or the Bursar's Office before you graduate or withdraw to be sure you receive your refund. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

If you enroll at the university the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account. It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established university policy, when you are no longer enrolled.

Residency

Students classified as out-of-state residents who are seeking in-state tuition classification for fall 1999 should turn in residency petitions by **5:00 p.m., July 26, 1999**, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 1B54, Campus Box 68, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions are accepted through August 27, 1999, but students who submit petitions after July 26 may not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application is approved.

Students submitting a completed petition by May 14, 1999, receive a decision by the enrollment deposit refund deadline of August 13, 1999. Financial aid recipients seeking in-state classification should submit their petitions by May 14, 1999, to make sure their financial aid award is processed in time for fall semester.

Complete information regarding the requirements for in-state residency status is available on our website at <http://registrar.colorado.edu/residenc.htm>, at the Tuition Classification Office, Regent 1B54, or by calling 303-492-6868.

Student Health Insurance for Fall 1999

If you do not receive an insurance packet in the mail in June, call 303-492-5107. Students enrolled for 6 credit hours or more are **automatically charged for Plan A** of the student health insurance (see page 28 for the rates). If you do not wish to be insured through the university-sponsored plan, **you must submit a selection/waiver form** to Wardenburg Health Center (WHC) by **September 1, 1999**. If you wish to waive insurance, the selection/waiver form is required because you will be responsible for your own health care costs. The university is not responsible for your medical expenses.

Plan A insurance provides up to 100 percent coverage for eligible costs incurred at Wardenburg Health Center. It also provides 75 to 100 percent coverage at other medical facilities, after a deductible is satisfied, dependent upon the type of service rendered and the provider. The plan provides up to \$250,000 in coverage per illness or injury on a world-wide basis. Benefits are provided year round when both fall and spring semester coverage are purchased. There are also other insurance options from which to select.

If you are taking 5 or fewer credit hours (this includes graduate students), or are enrolled in ACCESS, Continuing Education, or the Time Out Program, the university-sponsored health plan is available at the same price that full-time students pay. You may also purchase insurance for your spouse or your children. If you wish to enroll in the student health plan or you wish to enroll your spouse or dependent, you must sign up at WHC within the enrollment period, which is usually the first three weeks of the semester. Correspondence courses do not qualify you as eligible for enrollment in the student insurance plan. To become eligible to purchase the insurance, you must first pay full USCU student fees. **Exception:** Approved doctoral candidates requesting student insurance are charged the full price for the insurance, and USCU student fees are reduced.

The university will contribute a portion of the cost toward either Option A or B if you hold at least a 20 percent appointment as a teaching, research, or graduate assistant, or as a graduate part-time instructor.

If you do not wish to purchase university health insurance, complete a selection/waiver form to remove this charge from your bill. To be honored, waivers must be turned in to WHC by September 1, 1999. A selection/waiver form need not be submitted in the spring 2000 semester if you submitted one in the fall 1999 semester, unless you wish to change the insurance option for spring.

The selection/waiver form is a two-part form. Be sure to keep a copy for your files. If for some reason your original form does not reach the University Health Insurance Department, your copy will be honored through December 1, 1999.

If you fail to submit a selection/waiver form by September 1, 1999, you have the opportunity to petition the Student Health Board Fee Waiver Committee. If the committee denies your petition, you may appeal the decision to the

USCU Appellate Court. The decision of the Appellate Court is final. If you are unsuccessful in your appeal, you must pay the student health insurance fee or be disenrolled from the university. The petition and appeal processes are available to you for the first two months of a semester only.

For more information about other insurance options or if you have questions, call the Student Insurance Office at 303-492-5107.

Paying Your Bill

You may pay your bill by:

- **Cash** - All payments made by cash must be received at the cashier windows in the lobby of Regent.
- **Personal check, certified check, or cashier's check made payable to the University of Colorado** - If you pay by check, make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill, or use one of the tuition drop boxes at the north and south entrances of Regent. *Do not use campus mail.*

If you write a bad check (regardless of the amount) to the university, you may be subject to late charges and service charges, and a stop will be placed on your record. A \$17 returned-check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the university. You may also be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes.

The payment deadline is 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 1, 1999. Postmark dates are not honored. Credit cards are not accepted.

Do not include scholarship checks with your payment to the Bursar's Office. Instead, forward the scholarship check to the Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, Boulder, CO 80309-0106. If your scholarship check is not received in the financial aid scholarship office by the bill payment deadline, you are advised to make other arrangements to pay your bill to avoid late and service charges. The scholarship will be credited when it arrives and, in many cases, will generate a refund for you at the Bursar's Office.

If no specific instructions are provided by the donor, the financial aid office automatically divides private scholarships of \$500 or more equally between the fall and spring semesters. Private scholarships of less than \$500 will be applied in full to the current semester.

Scholarship checks should be made payable to the **University of Colorado** and sent to CU-Boulder, Scholarships, Campus Box 106, Boulder, CO 80309-0106.

If you purchase a parking permit, add a class, etc., *after you receive your original bill*, call 303-938-8110 for your current balance. A second bill will not be mailed before the tuition due date.

Original charges (less any adjustments) are always due on the first bill due date of the semester. A second bill reflecting new charges (and payments) will be mailed to your local mailing address approximately 10 days after

the first bill due date.

It is recommended that checks be written on a U.S. bank and in U.S. funds in order to avoid processing delays of up to three weeks and possible bank fees. If the delay extends beyond the tuition due date, late and service charges may be assessed.

NOTE: All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the university.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 175, Boulder, CO 80309-0041.

If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time. Call 303-938-8110 for your current balance.

The Bursar's Office hours from August 20 to September 3 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (Tuesday, August 31, and Wednesday, September 1, until 6:00 p.m.). Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for extended hours of service.

The Bursar's Office offers personal assistance to Spanish-speaking students and students with a disability. If you need assistance, stop by the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 150 or call 303-492-5381, or if deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

Tuition Payment Option: Deferred Tuition

By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you are allowed to pay one-half of the amount due on **September 1**. The minimum balance due, indicated on the reverse side of your bill, is reduced automatically by any credits (financial aid, insurance, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced. If there are changes, you can call CU Connect at 303-938-8110, or call 303-492-5091 for your current balance or access your current bill information on PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.

If the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the student billing windows in Regent from August 20 to September 1.

On **October 6**, you must pay the balance of your bill and a one-percent finance charge and any new charges added to your bill. A second bill reflecting this balance is mailed to your local mailing address the third week of September. Make sure your address is current.

Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

A **financial stop** will be placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline. This stop will prevent you from:

- registering for future terms
- participating in drop/add
- receiving an academic transcript
- receiving a diploma

In addition, if you are registered for a future term and a finance stop is added to your record, you are in risk of

losing those classes.

A late-payment charge, in addition to a service charge on the unpaid balance (one percent per month), is assessed according to the following schedule:

All past due accounts are referred to the Student Debt Management department for collection, where additional collection charges may be assessed.

Colorado law requires the university to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Central Collection Services Office (CCS). If your account is referred to CCS, you must pay any collection costs allowed by the Uniform Consumer Credit Code.

Getting Your Refund

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund. You can receive your refund either by:

• **Direct Deposit** - If you are currently enrolled for direct deposit, or sign up by August 4, and have a credit balance on your tuition account as of August 18, your fall 1999 refund will be deposited into your bank account on August 20. Throughout the semester, whenever your tuition account reflects a credit balance, your refund will be deposited to your bank account 24 hours after a credit balance appears on your tuition and fee account.

The university strongly encourages you to use this option. It insures safe and convenient payment of your refund.

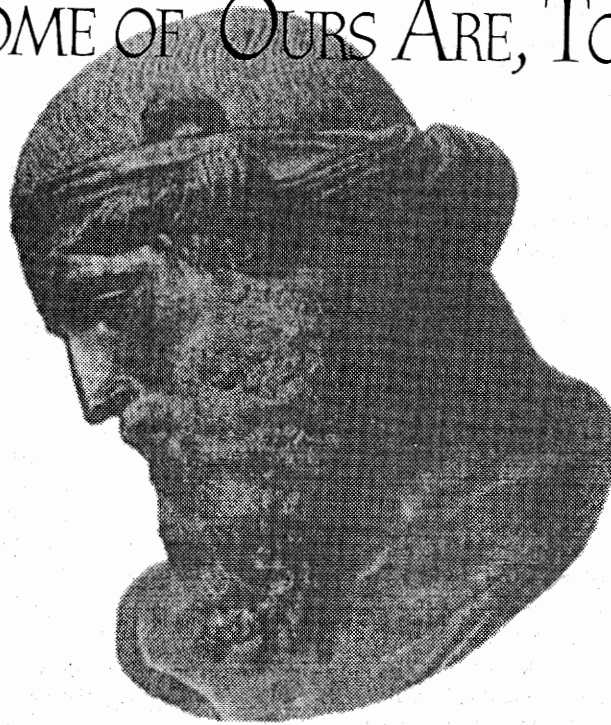
• **Refund Checks** - If you do not sign up for direct deposit, and your tuition account reflects a credit balance as of August 16, a refund check will be mailed to your local mailing address on August 19. This refund **cannot** be picked up.

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance after August 16, a refund check will be available at the cashier's window in Regent beginning August 20. You must have your photo ID with you. Checks not picked up will be mailed to your local mailing address on a monthly basis throughout the semester.

Financial Aid

If you meet all of the qualifications to receive financial aid funds, your scholarship(s), grant(s), and/or loan proceeds are automatically applied to your bill.

All Federal Direct Student Loans and Federal Perkins Loans are credited to your university bill, provided you meet all the eligibility criteria to receive your financial aid and you return all promissory notes.

If your financial aid pays your bill in full, and there is money remaining, you are entitled to a refund (see Getting Your Refund, page 32).

Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans up to \$500 are available to students during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least eighteen years of age and enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus to qualify (ACCESS and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer.

Veterans' Benefits

If you are entitled to veterans' benefits, write Veterans' Services, Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, Boulder, CO 80309-0106, or call 303-492-7322 for further information.

Withdrawing and Financial Aid

The *Withdrawal Policy Regarding Tuition and Fees* states that students who pay their \$200 enrollment deposit and register for classes for any given semester are obligated to pay full tuition and fees for that semester unless they **officially withdraw** from the university. If you withdraw before the first day of classes, all financial aid will be cancelled.

If you begin classes at CU-Boulder, receive financial aid, and then withdraw, your financial aid will be adjusted according to federal regulations (34CFR668.22). The Bursar's Office first calculates your tuition and fee charges according to your withdrawal date, and determines how much financial aid is to be retained to cover those charges. The Bursar's Office also determines allowable costs for books and supplies, living expenses, transportation, etc. based on the percentage of the semester completed at your date of withdrawal. If the financial aid you received exceeds your adjusted charges, excess funds must be "refunded" to the federal Title IV and other financial aid accounts. You will also be required to "repay" financial aid funds you received after your bill was paid if you received more than your allowable costs for living expenses, etc. The Office of Financial Aid is notified and adjustments are made to your financial aid award record.

There are three formulas that are used to determine the amount that needs to be refunded to federal Title IV or other financial aid accounts, and/or the amount to be repaid to the university. The formula that is most beneficial to the student will be used.

1. **Pro-Rata:** If you are a first-time student and you withdraw before 60 percent of the semester has passed, the Bursar's Office will calculate the "portion that remains" of the semester. They assess the amount of tuition and fees to be retrieved and calculate the amount of refund required for Title IV funds and other aid based on the percent of the semester you attended.

In the case of a prolonged illness, accident, death in the family, or other circumstances that make it impractical for you to complete the semester, the Bursar's Office will review the information you provide and will determine a settlement that is reasonable and fair to both you and the university.

Refunds

If you received financial aid other than work-study, and the calculation results in a refund to Title IV and other financial aid accounts, we return funds to the accounts in the following order: Federal Direct Stafford/Ford Loan,

(unsubsidized); Federal Direct Stafford/Ford Loan, (subsidized); Federal Direct PLUS (parent) loan; Federal Perkins Loan; Federal Pell Grant Program; Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG); Colorado Student Incentive Grant (CSIG); Other Title IV programs; Institutional Aid; Colorado Athletic Scholarship; Diversity Grant; Graduate Need Grant; Undergraduate Merit; Colorado Extended Studies; Colorado Student Grant (CSG); private sources; student.

The amount refunded to any program cannot be greater than the amount awarded from that fund. Refunds are rounded up to the nearest dollar. If a refund is made to a loan program, you or your parent will receive simultaneous notice of the refund. If you petition the Bursar's Office for a different rebate period and your petition is granted, we will recalculate the refund to the financial aid accounts. Examples of refund calculations are available upon request from the Office of Financial Aid.

Repayment

The following repayment policy is applied if you received financial aid for educational costs other than tuition and fees and then withdraw. Federal Direct Loans and work-study awards are excluded from this calculation.

To determine if you received an overpayment, we calculate the costs for your living expenses, travel, etc. (these are indirect education costs) for the time you were enrolled. If the refund check you received after your aid paid your bill exceeds this calculated amount, you will be required to repay the difference to the university. The following percentages will be assessed:

The portion of the refund you received that cannot be attributed to the cost of books and supplies, room and board, transportation, and medical expenses must be returned to the fund or funds from which it came. If you received aid from more than one fund, the overpayment will be returned to the funds in the order listed under "Refunds".

The Office of Financial Aid will return the amount calculated to the aid funds and then a bill will be created for you by the Bursar's Office. In the event that there is a balance due, your bill payments will be handled by the Bursar's Office.

General Information

Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered in this section.

Available Credit Courses for Eligible Special Students (ACCESS - formerly SAVE) Registration

Nondegree students (students not currently enrolled in a degree program at CU-Boulder) may take Boulder campus courses through the ACCESS (Available Credit Courses for Eligible Special Students) Program. Register through CU Connect or in person at the Continuing Education Office, 1505 University, beginning Friday, August 20. For information on registration eligibility and times please call 303-492-5148 or visit the ACCESS website at www.colorado.edu/conted/access.htm.

Addresses

The following addresses on your student record must be kept current:

- **Mailing address** (your address during the fall and spring semesters and during the summer months if you're enrolled in summer classes). Registration information for future semesters, outstanding tuition and fee bills, refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May (and throughout the summer if you're enrolled in summer classes). **Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break.
- **Permanent address** (considered your "home-base" address). It can be your parents' address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Schedule/bills are mailed to this address before the semester begins. This address is also used for mailings during the summer months and during the winter semester break. **Exception:** If you're enrolled in summer classes, your mailing address is used during the summer months.

Other offices, such as the library, housing, payroll, and Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes must be made there as well.

You can look up any of your addresses on the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus> (see page 39) and, if needed, update your addresses via PLUS. Or you can fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105, in the Office of Financial Aid in Environmental Design, room 2, or by calling 303-492-6970.

NOTE: The address that appears on your student record (and PLUS) also appears on the directory on CU-Boulder's home page on the web. When you make a change to any of your addresses, the change is normally updated on your student record within 24 hours. **Exception:** If you update your address via PLUS, your addresses are updated immediately (real-time). Addresses on the directory on the web are updated weekly.

Advising

Check your invitation to register for advising requirements. If advising is required or if you wish to speak with an advisor:

- Arts and Sciences students - You are expected to meet with your primary advisor or faculty advisor prior to registering. Contact your advisor or department to arrange an advising conference. If you are an open option student or considering changing your major, contact the Advising Center in Old Main, 303-492-7885 for an appointment. For arts and sciences advising information on the web, see <http://www.colorado.edu/ArtsSciences/core.html>.
- Engineering students - Call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office for advising.
- Students in any other college or school - Call your dean's office.

Campus ID Card (Buff OneCard™)

The Buff OneCard™ is your official CU-Boulder student ID. It allows you access to the Student Recreation Center, campus libraries, meal plans, RTD buses, athletic events, some areas of residence halls, and anywhere else that official CU-Boulder identification is required.

The Buff OneCard™ office is located in the lower level of the UMC. Office hours are Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Some form of picture ID is required in order to receive your Buff OneCard™, and there is no initial charge for the card to full-fee paying students. There is a \$15 replacement fee for lost cards. To report a lost or stolen card, call 303-492-1212 immediately to avoid unauthorized use of your card. DO NOT share your Buff OneCard™ with anyone else.

Buff Bucks is the Buff OneCard™'s optional on-campus debit account. If you choose to activate this option, you can make purchases at some campus vending machines and campus merchants. You can deposit funds to your Buff Bucks account at the OneCard Office or at Buff Bucks Transaction Machines located in the UMC, the Student Recreation Center, and Williams Village. You can store up to \$250 in your Buff Bucks account. Since it is not a bank account, cash withdrawals cannot be made, and a fee is charged if you choose to close the account.

Through an agreement with the U of C Federal Credit Union, the Buff OneCard™ also offers the Buff Gold option. This option allows you to link your Buff OneCard™ with your Credit Union account to get cash from ATMs and to make debit card purchases from establishments that belong to the Star/Explore network (such as King Soopers and Safeway grocery stores). To activate this option, open a share draft account at the U of C Federal Credit Union.

You may also elect to use your Buff OneCard™ as a **long distance calling card** through MCI. You will receive 10 free minutes of long-distance by calling and obtaining your MCI authorization code and PIN. (If you are a residence hall student, direct dialing costs less than using the calling card.)

Changing Your College or Major

If you want to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with the new dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. If you have already submitted an IUT (intrauniversity transfer) application, register as if you have been accepted into the new school or college.

NOTE: You may not be able to register for some courses until you have been accepted into your new school or college. Once you are accepted, you may change your schedule through the drop/add deadline.

If you want to change or declare a major, go to the new major department for the required procedures.

NOTE: If you are or will be receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid may be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the lower level of Environmental Design, or call 303-492-5091.

Confidentiality of Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords you certain rights with respect to your education records. They are:

- (1) The right to inspect and review your education records within 45 days of the day the university receives a request for access.

You should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, written



requests that identify the record(s) you wish to inspect. The university official will make arrangements for access and notify you of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the university official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise you of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

(2) The right to request the amendment of your education records that you believe are inaccurate or misleading.

You may ask the university to amend a record that you believe is inaccurate or misleading. You should write the university official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the university decides not to amend the record as requested by you, the university will notify you of the decision and advise you of your right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to you when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent of disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in your education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the university in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the university has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person serving on the Board of Regents; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or one assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the university discloses education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado at Boulder as public or "directory" information: name, addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail address, Buff OneCard™ photo and number (not social security number), dates of attendance, registration status, class, major field of study,

awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, and date and place of birth. Such information may be disclosed by the institution at its discretion.

You have the right to withhold "directory information" from inquirers by selecting a "privacy" or "limited-privacy" option. The privacy option will prevent all directory and enrollment information from being released to all who do not have a clear educational interest for access to this information. The limited-privacy option will prevent the release of directory information to off-campus inquirers and to campus directory services, but is not as restrictive as the privacy option.

Credit-Hour Limits and Course-Load Definitions

During the registration period, undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), *including wait-listed courses*.

During the final drop/add period, undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, *including wait-listed courses*. **NOTE:** A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.

For undergraduate students, 12 credit hours is considered a full-time load for financial aid and for enrollment verification purposes. Graduate students qualify for full-time status for enrollment verification purposes if they are enrolled for 5 or more hours or any number of thesis hours. Law students need 10 or more hours for full-time status. Check with the Office of Financial Aid for their full-and part-time status definitions for graduate students.

Credit and Grading Options

You can select or change the following credit and grading options via CU Connect and web registration through 5:00 p.m. on September 1 or at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on September 10. (*Important: Be sure to read the highlighted note on page 38.*)

• **No Credit.** To register for a course on a no-credit basis, call CU Connect and select the no-credit option (see page 14), or select the no-credit option when registering via the web. You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course, but you do not receive a grade. An *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used. **NOTE:** No-credit courses do not count toward full-time enrollment for financial aid purposes.

• **Pass/Fail.** Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, call CU Connect and select the pass/fail option (see page 14), or select the pass/fail option when registering via the web.

Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is *not* noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course.

A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted.

NOTE: If you attempt to change the status of a course from or to *P/F* or *NC* by telephone or via the web, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course. You can make this change without jeopardizing your enrollment in the course by filling out a credit-option form at the registrar's office in Regent 105 (through September 10), at the Coors Events/Conference Center (August 20 and 22), or in Regent 1B60 (August 23 - September 1).

- **Variable Credit.** All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (that is, they have a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you call CU Connect to register, or if registering for a variable credit course via the web, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed throughout the registration and drop/add periods through 5:00 p.m., Friday, September 10.

E-Mail the Registrar

Have you ever had an academic records-related or registration-related question but didn't know whom to ask? Or have you ever had a comment you wanted to share with us about one of our programs or processes?

E-mail the registrar's office at registrar@colorado.edu to get some answers or make your comments. Your e-mails will be read by a staff member in the registrar's office and then forwarded to the appropriate person for a response.

Grade Information

To obtain information about grades at the end of the semester:

- Call CU Connect, the telephone registration system, at 303-938-8110, during regular hours of operation (see page 14). When prompted to enter an application code, enter a "2" to access the grading application. You'll then need to enter the term code for the semester you want to access, followed by your student number and your PIN. Term codes consist of the last two digits in the year followed by one of these numbers:

- 1 = spring
- 4 = summer
- 7 = fall

For **spring semester 1999** grades (available beginning May 13), use the **term code 991**.

For **fall semester 1999** grades (available beginning December 26), use the **term code 997**.

- Look up your grades on PLUS on the World Wide Web, <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. Fall semester 1999 grades will be available on PLUS beginning December 23.
- Check to see if your grades are posted, as many instructors post grades for their courses outside of their offices, the classroom, or the departmental office.
- Order official transcripts at no charge by writing to:

These can also be ordered through a signed FAX request to 303-492-4884, or via a telephone request to 303-492-8987. Your transcript will be mailed out within four working days.

- Order an unofficial transcript for a cost of \$1 (next-day service) or \$5 (same-day service) at the transcript window, Regent lobby, or by calling **303-492-8987**. Unofficial transcripts are not mailed off campus.

- You can order transcripts by using the campus' web transcript ordering service. The URL for this service is www.gettranscript.com/, and select the University of Colorado, Boulder. Transcripts through this service cost \$1.50 each. These can also be ordered by calling 1-800-613-3735.

Graduation

If you plan to graduate within the next year, you must check with your dean's office for graduation application deadlines and notification procedures.

Graduating students with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university.

Graduation rates for full-time freshmen: Entering in '93, 4-year rate: 35%. Entering in '92, 5-year rate: 56%. Entering in '91, 6-year graduation rate: 65%.

NOTE: If you are or will be receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid may be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the lower level of Environmental Design, or call 303-492-5091.

World Wide Web Sites

The CU-Boulder web site provides important information regarding registration, a listing of available courses, the final exam schedule, course descriptions, information about the Buff OneCard™, tuition, and more.

More than 60 computer labs (all with Internet access) are located in buildings and residence halls throughout the campus including Business, Clare Small Arts & Sciences, Duane Physics, Economics, Education, Ekeley Sciences, Engineering, Environmental Design, Fleming Law, Helms, Ketchum, Macky, Muenzinger, and Norlin Library. AVAILABLE COURSES ON THE WORLD WIDE WEB

You can conduct on-line course searches via web registration. The web registration course search tool allows you to search by subject, level, course number, core requirements, and by meeting time. The course search is updated on a real-time basis, so if you find a course you

would like to sign up for, you immediately know whether there is still room in the course. You can access web registration via PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus/>.

The schedule planner is a tool to find out additional course information. Using this feature, you can also search for courses by subject, core requirements, and by meeting time. When a course is displayed, you can access the course description, required books, and student ratings of the course. In addition, you can map out your schedule to show when you have courses and other scheduled commitments, such as work. The schedule planner is updated on a daily basis during registration periods so it is a good planning resource, but does not display up-to-the-minute course availability. You can access the schedule planner feature via PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus/>.

Concurrent Registration

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the fall and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are

met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final drop/add period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all courses.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning August 2. For information, call 303-492-8494.

Note to Graduate Students: Check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

Course Reservation Program

The Course Reservation Program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a course and enroll in that course for the next semester before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder that utilize wait lists, except for controlled enrollment courses, are included in the Course Reservation Program.

You are eligible to participate in the Course Reservation Program for *spring semester 2000* if your name is on a wait list for a course as of 5:00 p.m. on September 1 (the wait list deadline), and you don't get enrolled in the course.

NOTE: This applies only to course wait lists on the Student Information System (SIS), not wait lists that may be kept manually by a department.

If you are on a course wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on September 1, you should plan to come into the registrar's office, Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., **October 25 - 29** to register for the course for spring 2000. Registrations will *not* be honored through the Course Reservation Program after October 29. In addition, all restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering. You will register for all other spring 2000 courses during your regular registration time assignment.

Faculty and Staff Registration

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 credit hours each year without paying tuition. Course work must be taken outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to the employing department. For more information, call 303-492-5381.

High School Concurrent Program

The High School Concurrent Program is coordinated by the Division of Continuing Education. Registration is available through the ACCESS (formerly SAVE) and Boulder evening programs. For information on eligibility and times for registration using CU Connect, please call 303-492-5148 or visit the ACCESS website at www.colorado.edu/conted/access.htm.

Intercampus Registration

If you want to take course work on another University of

Colorado campus but not go through the concurrent registration program, apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campus except in the summer.)

Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for fall 1999, you must complete registration by **midnight on August 13**.

(Exception: Incoming freshmen and transfer students attending the final arts and sciences and business orientation session must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on August 19). If you do not register by the appropriate deadline (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories are eligible for late registration. In addition, a lower registration priority and a **\$50 late fee** are applied.

If you are a continuing student, call 303-492-6970 on August 16 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new or readmitted student, go to Admissions Operations in Regent 1B65 (303-492-2451) to check for eligibility. Students who are eligible for late registration must go to the registrar's office in Regent 105 (August 16 - 19), to the Coors Events/Conference Center (August 20 and 22), or to Regent 1B60 (August 23 - September 1) to be set up for late registration.

Parking Permits and Bicycle Registration

To buy a parking permit, you must bring a photo ID and a valid state motor-vehicle registration form. The costs for an academic year permit (August - May) are: \$162, \$216, \$261, and \$270. Semester rates are: \$81, \$108, \$130.50 and \$135. Motorcycle permits cost \$27 per semester or \$54 for academic year (all prices are subject to change). You can pay with cash, check, credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express), or charge it to your tuition and fee bill.

Parking permit sales take place at the Coors Events/Conference Center, concourse level, according to the following schedule (**subject to change**):

Time Out Program

The Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity for you to take a leave from the university for a semester or a year without losing your place in your current college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Readmission to the university is guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. A nonrefundable \$40 application fee is charged. The TOP application deadline for fall semester is **October 6**. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, 303-492-8673.

Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from fall semester 1999, you can fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 7, Boulder, CO 80309-0007. (Exception: Nondegree students withdraw through Continuing Education, 1505 University Ave., Campus Box 178, Boulder, CO 80309-0178.)

You need not drop your courses; this is done for you.

NOTE: If you drop all your courses and don't re-register for courses, you are considered withdrawn from the university and you should notify the registrar's office.

If you are registered for courses and do not officially withdraw from the university by contacting the registrar's office, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses.

Remember: Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.

NOTE: If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program (see above) or reapply through

the Office of Admissions. (Students remaining enrolled in only Continuing Education classes must still either reapply or go on TOP to return to Boulder main campus.)

Tuition assessments for students with financial aid may differ from those listed on this page. Please check with the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

Withdrawing students (including students applying for the Time Out Program) with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university. Failure to do so will result in a stop on your record. This stop will prevent you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work at the university and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the Student Loans Department in the Bursar's Office at 303-492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

About Course Listings

Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

1000-2999	Lower-division courses
3000-4999	Upper-division courses
5000-5999	Courses intended for graduate students and qualified undergraduates

6000-8999 Courses open to graduate students only

Enrollment in courses with a 700-, 800-, or 900-level section number is controlled by each department. The department staff either gives you the five-digit course call number so you can register for the course via CU Connect, enrolls you in the course directly on the computer, or gives you a special action form to take to a central drop/add site (during the final drop/add period *only*) or to the registrar's office.

Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of the course listings include:

Core Diamonds—A diamond (◆) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core curriculum requirement. (Refer to the College of Business Degree Requirements brochure for information on courses that fulfill the College of Business core curriculum requirements.)

Course Title—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

Section Number—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. The three-digit number alone is the lecture number. When an R, L, P, or S precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R), a laboratory (L), a practicum (P), or a

studio (S), which must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses may have three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

Call Number—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect and via web registration.

Time/Days—Meeting time and days of the class (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

Building/Room—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See this page and the next for the building abbreviations.)

Maximum Enrollment—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed.

Remember: Some courses may not be available to you due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations. In this case, CU Connect and web registration will inform you with an appropriate message.

Department Headings—These will include the phone number and the department location.

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 116). You must take one course per MAPS deficiency per term. **Please note the following change in policy: If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS. Please contact your academic advisor for additional information.**

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the University of Colorado Catalog.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 6, 8, 9 and 10 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one core requirement.

Minimum Academic Preparation Standards

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the Minimum Academic Preparation Standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

English	4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
Mathematics	3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
Natural Science	3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
Social Science	3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography.)
Foreign Language	completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
 2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
 3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.
 4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.
 5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.
 6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.
 7. **Please note the following change in policy: If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS.**
